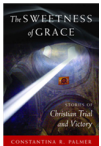
Matushka Constantina Palmer



Constantina R. Palmer is from New Brunswick, a quaint province on Canada's Atlantic coast. She lived in Thessaloniki, Greece, for almost six years, during which time she received a Master's degree in theology from Aristotle University, studied

Cretan style iconography, as well as Byzantine chant. Not one to simply learn from books, she also spent significant time at a number of women's monasteries throughout northern Greece. Currently, she lives with her husband, an Orthodox priest, in the province of Newfoundland and Labrador in Canada, serving the only Orthodox parish on the island of Newfoundland. She is also a social worker.

Matushka Constantina has authored two books:



The Sweetness of Grace is a collection of stories derived from conversations with Orthodox nuns, monks, and laypeople, along with experiences of Orthodox life in South Korea, Greece, and North America.

These stories of faith, courage, struggle, and everyday miracles will inspire and delight you.

The Scent of Holiness: Lessons from a Women's Monastery is a collection of stories of Constantina Palmer's frequent trips to women's monasteries in Northern Greece, and is meant to be a modern-day Materikon written by a layperson for laypeople. Although the stories take place at a handful of monasteries, she has set them all in the one monastery to which she traveled most often.
